# ESTHER

*“Seeing our life as a means and not an end.”*

**A** **BIDING PRINCIPLE** – The lives of committed believers are inseparably wedded to the purposes of God. This means we must be alert for the spiritual opportunities that lie just beneath the surface of our circumstances. Our lives are a means for God's work, not an end in themselves.

**I**n fulfillment of Jeremiah's warnings, Jerusalem was destroyed and most of its inhabitants carried off to Babylon early in the 6th century B.C. During their seventy-year exile, the Jews heard countless stories of political intrigue and suspense as nations flourished and fell. They watched the Persians overthrow their captors, the Babylonians. The Jews were undoubtedly astonished and overjoyed when Cyrus, the Persian king, issued an edict allowing them to return to Jerusalem to begin the arduous task of rebuilding their lives, beginning with the center of their nation: the Temple in Jerusalem.

The Book of Esther tells a story that takes place between the accounts of two migrations of Jews back to Jerusalem, which are recorded in the Book of Ezra. In it, a young Jewish beauty finds her own world reeling in the capital city of Susa, Persia. One day she's an orphan, the next she's queen of the most powerful empire on the planet! It has all the classic elements of a fairy-tale script—except one: this is real!

Esther learns that for those who love and serve the God of the Bible, there are no coincidences—only choices.

**KEY SCRIPTURE:** Read the Book of Esther in one sitting (if possible)

## STUDY QUESTIONS...

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1. What can you discern about Esther from Esther 2:10,15,20?

How might a character quality such as this be of great significance in the life of someone who loves God?

2. The entire book of Esther pivots on the last half of what Mordecai's said in 4:14. What exactly is he getting at here?

If Mordecai was correct, what was God's purpose in what happened in 2:8-17? Explain.

3. Mordecai wanted Esther not to confuse the means with the end when it comes to life's circumstances. Why is this such good timeless counsel?
  
4. Look at the five groups of Scripture passages below. In the space beneath each of them, write out what God really wanted to *accomplish* (the "end") and how He went about it (the "means").

<b>The Means</b>	<b>The End</b>
Genesis 37:12-13, 23,28	Genesis 41:39-41; 42:1-2
1 Samuel 17:17-19	1 Samuel 17:26; 17:40 - 18:2
Luke 2:1-5	Matthew 2:1-6
John 4:4-7	John 4:28-30, 39-42
Acts 6:1-5	Acts 6:12-15; 7:54 - 8:1

5. Reflect on these five accounts of God's means and ends from question 4. What truth for your *own* life can you distill regarding you as an individual and the overall plans of God?
  
6. Some critics believe that the Book of Esther should not be in the Bible because God is *never* once named in the book, even though there are nearly 200 references to the King of Persia! Look at Psalm 77:19. How do you see the truth of that verse illustrated repeatedly in the Book of Esther?

7. In the Old Testament, one of the words translated "ways" means "a journey, a path, a way of life." What are two truths about God's "ways" that you can see from the two verses below?

Isaiah 55:8-9 and Psalm 103:7

8. Take some time right now and reflect on your "station" in life as it relates to status, job, geographical location, financial profile, "network," etc. Do you think you *where* you are as a result of God "putting" you there for a reason, or because He has merely let you have your own way? Explain.

Of what value or service would you say you are to Him right where you are?

Have there been any instances in the past that were opportunities for *you* to be an "Esther" that you either missed or ignored? Explain.

Have there been any instances in the past that were opportunities for you to be an "Esther" that you saw as opportunities and responded? Explain.

Are there any instances right now that are opportunities for you to be an "Esther"? Explain.

9. Have you thought of who and where you are, and what you do, as either an "end" or a "means"? If an end, explain what that end is. If only a means, what would you say the end then is?
10. Do you need to reaffirm your availability to God's purposes, or ask Him for insight to "see" His footprints in the path of your present journey? Perhaps you need to ask His forgiveness for confusing the "means" and "end" of your life's circumstances. Thoughtfully write out a prayer expressing your present desires in this whole area, date the prayer, and put it in your Bible as a reminder.

- My perspective versus others' perspectives – Genesis 50:18-20

## **OPTIONAL**

Think back over your life. How many specific situations can you think of where it is now possible to see God's "footprints" all along the way. Take one of those situations and contact another person who was involved. Express to that person your gratitude to God for what He did during that time.
