BIDING PRINCIPLE – The rule of God in my heart means that my mission here on earth looks more and more like His. Rather than looking out for myself, I am looking to bring the good news of the gospel to those who share the space around me.

"I spent my life climbing the ladder of success, only to discover it was leaning against the wrong wall! – Unknown

For many people, life is a ladder of achievements. They study and strive to move-up their ladder, one accomplishment at a time. And the path of monetary, social, and professional growth is fairly predictable. They then tend to measure progress by a host of socially approved emblems: marriage, home, cars, corporate status, and a collection of visible "toys." Unfortunately, for a growing number of believers the pursuit is the same; it is just has different "labels" on the path to make it sound more spiritual.

The bigger truth is each of us is chasing *something*. For some, it turns out to be "the wind." For others, it is an edifice that will transcend time. An eternal treasure. Jesus spoke three times as much about this one particular pursuit than He did about His own Father! What *is* this profession that is supposed to fuel the passions of those who are being changed into the likeness of Christ? What *are* we to be "running after"? And, more personally, what exactly are *you* pursuing?
